Bentley Park College has introduced a Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) Program to integrate technology into education effectively. This program allows students to use their personal devices as learning tools, facilitating a seamless transition between school and home. It also aims to foster a sense of ownership, responsibility, and independence while enhancing students' technology skills.

To ensure an optimal learning experience, please ensure that your child's device meets the minimum specifications listed below. While these are recommendations, considerations such as affordability, functionality, accidental protection insurance, and extended warranty are also important when selecting a device.

Why Does Your Child Need a BYOD Device?

- Enhanced Learning and Engagement: Boosts classroom learning and engagement.
- Independent Learning: Facilitates self-directed learning at home.
- Seamless Curriculum Access: Ensures smooth access to the curriculum both at school and home.
- Increased Participation: Promotes student participation, collaboration and positive engagement during class.
- Student-Driven Learning: Empowers students to take charge of their learning.
- Flexible Learning Options: Offers a variety of online learning programs and tools for use at home and school.
- Supports Diverse Learning Styles: Encourages and accommodates different learning styles and abilities.
- Expanded Learning Opportunities: Provides access to higher and extended learning opportunities.
- Improved Technology Skills: Enhances students' technology proficiency.
- Software Access: Office 365 suite is provided by the school and Adobe Creative Cloud at \$10 per year.
- Educational Tools: Access to ClickView, The Learning Place, QLearn, and Microsoft Teams.
- Smart Online Learning Suite: Availability of Smart Online Learning Suite.
- E-Textbooks: Access to e-textbooks including JacPlus.
- Primary School Resources: Access to Mathletics, Reading Eggs, and Online Learning Tools.
- Secondary School Resources: Access to Mathspace and Mathletics.
