Unit name			Medieval Europe	Spanish conquest of the Americas	
Unit description			A study of Medieval Europe exposes students to a period of history fundamentally different from their own and challenges their minds and imaginations. In this unit, students investigate the social, cultural, economic and political features of Medieval Europe, focusing on the roles and relationships of different groups within society, as defined by crimes and punishments of the period.  Key questions include:  How did societies change from the end of the ancient period to the beginning of the modern age?  What key beliefs and values emerged and how did they influence societies?	Students will examine pre- Columbian life in the Americas, including social organisation, city life and beliefs, investigate the reasons behind European exploration and expansion and investigate the nature of the contact and conflict between the Spanish conquistadors and the Aztecs and the subsequent effects on both groups of people in the short- and longer-term.  Key questions include:  What were the causes and effects of contact between societies in this period?  Which significant people, groups and ideas from this period have influenced the world today?
