Lunchtime Detention Policy

Rationale

At Bentley Park College, we strive to support students to learn in a positive, safe, supportive environment. While there is a range of rewards for students for positive behaviours, they are also consequences for those who choose to take part in negative behaviours that compromise the learning and wellbeing of others, outlined in the **Lunchtime Detention Policy**.

Purpose

To clearly outline the Lunchtime Detention Policy so students and staff understand its application.

Operation of the Policy

The lunchtime detention policy at Bentley Park College is a measure aimed at deterring negative student behaviours. The Responsible Thinking Classroom (RTC) is the classroom in which detentions are conducted in both Primary and Secondary.

In Primary and Secondary

Lunchtime detentions are administered by classroom teachers for non-completion of class work.

In Secondary

Students arriving late unaccompanied by their parent/carer or without a note from them will collect a late slip and receive a lunchtime detention.

Students will also receive a lunchtime detentions for:

- being late to class two or more times in a week
- two or more uniform violations in a week (without a reasonable excuse)
- truancy
- two or more RTC referrals in a week
- non-submission of assessment.

The following staff can administer lunchtime detentions:

- curriculum Heads of Department
- the Responsible Behaviour Officer (RBO)
- Student Services Officers
- Head Of Department Junior Secondary
- Head of Department Senior Secondary

The completion of lunchtime detentions is taken very seriously at Bentley Park College. Once given they are expected to be completed in a timely fashion. Students that have three or more outstanding lunchtime detentions will have their parent/carer notified and further actions will be taken.
