

Minimum Expectations for 'Good Standing'

Attendance

- ☑ No more than 10% unexplained full day absences in the last five weeks
- ☑ No more than 10% unexplained or unacceptable reasons for lateness to school in the last five weeks
- ☑ No incidents of truancy in the last five weeks

Behaviour

- ☑ No outstanding after school detentions
- ☑ Positive Behaviour Monitoring Card expectations met upon return from suspension

Assessment

- ☑ All assignments submitted by the due date unless an extension has been granted by the HOD

- ☑ Attend all exams unless a medical certificate is provided
- ☑ All assessment pieces completed with an acceptable level of effort, including no plagiarism or cheating

Uniform

- ☑ Consistently wear the uniform as per the Uniform Policy, including wearing correct footwear. No more than three uniform violations in the last five week period

Note: *It is the expectation that students wanting to pay for costs that are non-essential to learning (e.g. senior shirts and jerseys, fees for camps and other extra-curricular activities) have paid their school fees in full or have maintained the payment schedule agreed upon with the college. Failure to do so may result in students not being allowed access to these privileges.*

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


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What is the 'Good Standing' Policy all about?

As part of the college's commitment to School-Wide Positive Behaviour Support (SWPBS), Bentley Park College focuses on improving student standards and performance by rewarding positive behaviours.

In Years 7 to 12 the 'Good Standing' Policy allows students who meet certain expectations to access privileges that are part of the educational experience at the college.



Privileges for students on 'Good Standing'

Students of 'Good Standing' will be eligible to participate in a range of privileges, which include:

- Excursions (non-compulsory for assessment)
- School camps and ski trip
- Representing the college in sporting, cultural and other activities (including TCS, Peninsula and State sport)
- Leadership positions within the college
- Rewards days
- Year 12 formal (including as a guest of another student)
- Other social functions organised by the college

Consequences for students who do not achieve 'Good Standing'

Students who do not meet the minimum expectations will not be eligible to participate in the above privileges.

Final decisions will be made at the discretion of the College Principal, in consultation with the Deputy Principals, HOD Junior / Senior Secondary, Year Coordinators and teachers. Personal circumstances will be acknowledged and taken into consideration in the decision making process.

How is a student's 'Good Standing' checked?

When a student wishes to represent the college or participate in one of the privileges listed on the left they must apply for a 'Good Standing Check' with the Engagement Officer in College Administration. This should be done at least two weeks prior to the activity taking place. The Engagement Officer will review the student's records for the previous five weeks to ensure the criteria for 'Good Standing' has been met.

Students will then be advised if they are on 'Good Standing'. Students who have not yet met the 'Good Standing' criteria will be informed of this and given the opportunity to rectify the issues identified to get back on 'Good Standing'. If these issues are not rectified, the student may not participate in the desired activity or represent the college.
