- Use the Inquiry Cycle in teams through Alignment, Precision and Intentional Collaboration to identify the 'right work' and do the 'work right. Having a focus on teacher capability in pedagogy and curriculum

 protocols of classroom observation and feedback to support professional development, encouraging
